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SETTING THE SCENE: BENELUX

BENELUX mission statement

The Benelux is a transnational cooperation between Belgians, Dutch and Luxembourgers. We are committed to a region without borders, because this creates more prosperity, mobility, security and sustainability for all. The Benelux is therefore the ideal testing ground to promote European integration.



SETTING THE SCENE: BENELUX

- Benelux area (ad hoc cooperation) vs **Benelux Union** (treaty based).
- Legal instruments: decisions, agreements, recommendations, recommendations, directives.
- Decision of the Benelux Committee of Ministers on mutual automatic recognition of the level of higher education degrees M (2015)3 of 18.05.2015 is the first Benelux Decision in the field of education.

SETTING THE SCENE: BENELUX

Why a Benelux **Decision**?

- Strong enough to guarantee the right of citizens to automatic recognition of their degree
- Relatively light-weight procedure without heavy Parliamentary procedure



POLITICAL RATIONALE

- 1. Expression of mutual trust in each others' quality between five closely interconnected education systems (3 Communities of Belgium, Netherlands, Luxembourg) all aligned to the European Higher Education Area (Bologna Process)
- 2. Background: common commitment to instruments of EHEA: UNESCO/COE LRC, ESG for QA in EHEA and to lesser degree QF for EHEA (in 2015)



POLITICAL RATIONALE

3. Expansion of partial arrangements for automatic recognition:

- between NL and BE/FL
- between the 3 Belgian Communities
- semi-automatic recognition practice in LU of other EU HE qualifications.



SCOPE OF THE DECISION

- 1. **Level** of degrees
- 18.05.2015: Bachelor and Master
- 25.01.2018: short cycle/associate degree + Ph.D.
- = ALL HE degrees

- 2. Automatic (vs procedural) recognition
- = legal right for the citizen



SCOPE OF THE DECISION

- 3. Generic (vs specific) recognition
- = recognition of level

- 4. Academic (vs professional) recognition
- = seen from angle of value as learning qualification



LESSONS LEARNT

- Shared commitment to European transparency instruments was helpful as extra support but not key factor for success.

- Above all it was the confidence in each others' quality without requiring 100 % identical systems, standards, checking etc. that made the Benelux countries "jump into the water" together!



LESSONS LEARNT

What were the success factors?

- 1. Legal right making the instrument more powerful/relevant
- 2. Spill-over effect from generic to specific recognition
- 3. Spill-over effect from academic recognition to the world of employers in the Benelux area
- Strong support of (interconnected) academic community no autocratic Governmental decision – Governments were "pushed" by Rectors' Conferences to take the political step
- = 4 FACTORS OF **TRUST** creating a genuine Benelux Higher Eduction Area
- = MODEST start in 2015 and expand in 2018
 Vlaanderen

LINK TO EEA AND SCHOOLS

Can this model be extended to school education?

- EU Recommendation on automatic recognition of 2018 in line with UNESCO/COE Lisbon Recognition Covention => qualifications giving access to higher education (indirect link with SE) LRC principle of fair recognition/"substantial" differences
- Obstacles: wider divergence in structures and length of compulsory education – national Governments less keen to give up subsidiarity
- "Solution": **trust in decisions at school level** for taking up responsibility for smooth progression between grades for students coming from other school systems.
