



The Role of a School Counselor



The Role of the School Counselor

- We report to the headmaster and the Inspector from the Ministry of Education
- At the beginning of the year we give a questionnaire to the first year students
- Arrange an interview with them and gather all necessary information
- We call a meeting with all teachers of the school and inform them, about their students' history



School Counselor's Role

A. Career Guidance

1. We work in middle, and high schools to provide academic, career, college access, and personal/social competencies to K-12 students.

2. The interventions used include developmental school counseling curriculum lessons, annual planning for every student, and group or individual counseling.

3. We use the Career Gate Test in order to help students to decide what they want to do in their life

4. We organize many activities and that depends from the counselor



B. Family matters

We deal with any matters arising from the family that create anxiety to the students i.e. divorce, parents fights

C. Economic problems

Many families now experience financial problems, thus a number of students get financial aid from the school

D. Health problems

Students report there health problems that may happen while at school, so someone will know how to treat them like epilepsy, diabetes ect.
